FLAG HOISTING CEREMONY AT PAKISTAN EMBASSY, TOKYO



MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT OF JATA




The Ambassador met with the President of Japan Association of Travel Agents Mr. Tadashi Shimura and discussed prospects of tourism promotion between the two countries. The Ambassador stated that Pakistan has been a favourite tourist destination around the world including Japan besides Karachi remained a key transit point for tourists visiting Africa and Europe for a longer period of time. The Ambassador stated that there had been security concerns for the last few years in Pakistan but now things have

changed drastically and security has improved remarkably. The Ambassador emphasized that most of the cities in Pakistan including the big cities like Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad etc. are safer than many big cities of the world. Hence, it is simply the question of perception which needs to be changed with regard to security concerns in Pakistan. The Ambassador explained that due to various infrastructural development projects in Pakistan, the access to many tourists' spots have been

upgraded and become more convenient to visit. These specially inclued the Northern Areas of Pakistan where many towering peaks of the world are also located. The Japanese mountaineers also have been visiting these peaks regularly. Pakistan is also the cradle of Gandhara civilization and these historical places carry immense attraction for tourists. Hence, there is immense potential for promotion of tourism between the two countries which needs to be explored.
